Biography:

Chin-Feng Hsueh began working as a lawyer in 1995. He joined the Taiwan Association for Human Rights (TAHR) several years later and had the opportunity to be involved in a number of human rights cases taking place at the time, including human rights in the armed forces and restrictions on the use of police powers. Hsueh also served as the chairman of the Human Rights Protection Committee of the Taipei Bar Association during the same period. As one of the purposes of the committee was to provide pro bono death penalty defense lawyers, he paid close attention to the issue of abolition of the death penalty. Recommendation by TAHR enabled him to assist in the advocacy of legal aid regulations and to serve as the director of the Banqiao Branch of the Legal Aid Foundation until 2011. Hsueh was involved in advocating legal aid and devising policies for the branch. Hsueh is currently a





member of the lawyer review committee at the Legal Aid Foundation and assists the LAF in devising lawyer review systems and investigating appeal cases with the aim of ensuring the ongoing improvement of quality of legal aid.
