Social Workers at The Legal Aid Society

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Attorney

- Provide direct legal representation
- Engage in social services advocacy
- Work with pro bono attorneys

Paralegal Casehandler

- Provide advice and brief services to clients
- Under supervision of an attorney, provide client representation in administrative proceedings
- Conduct factual and legal research

Client Client Investigator

- Performing investigative research
 - Testifying as a witness on matters



Social Worker

- Perform Initial Needs Assessment
- Perform crisis intervention
- Provide social services assistance advocacy
- Provide service referrals and follow-up
- Develop mitigation strategies

Social Workers

Forensic Social Worker (FSW)

- Forensic social work is the application of social work training to questions/issues relating to law/legal systems.
- FSWs hold advanced master level degree (MSW)
- Many are licensed professionals (LSW, LCSW) where they receive ongoing specialized training



Social Workers

Clinical Social Worker

- Clinical social work is a specialty practice area of social work which focuses on the assessment, diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of mental illness, emotional and other behavioral disturbances.
- Individual, group and family therapy are common treatment modalities



Social Workers

Case Worker

 Case Worker social work is commonly employed by social welfare agencies to help people obtain basic needs like food assistance, mental health care, medical care, and housing assistance

- Collaboration with all legal team members
- Consistent client engagement
- Mental Health Diagnosis and Assessment
- Comprehensive Bio-Psycho-Social Reports



What Social Workers Do As Part of an Interdisciplinary Team (cont.)

- Investigation and Assessment of Mitigation Themes and Advocacy
- Family Communication and Engagement
- Treatment Recommendations
- Re-entry Planning



Why Should We Include Social Workers on the Team

- Enhances Legal Representation
- Ability to Assess More In-Depth Mitigation
- Deeper Understanding of Factors Impacting Clients



Why Should We Include Social Workers on the Team (cont.)

- Expert Refinement of Client Narrative
- Client Benefits
- Validity and Assurance to the Court



Role of the Social Worker on This Integrated Team

- Obtain and review records
- Identify assistance to best address needs
- Develop a record for purposes of showing willingness to utilize services, as well as compliance



Role of the Social Worker on This Integrated Team (cont.)

- Develop an effective client narrative tell the client's story – individualize and contextualize
- Obtain letters of support, develop mitigation reports

Ethical Considerations

Mandatory Reporters vs. Agent of the Team and Client Confidentiality

- Social workers as an integrated member of the team are covered under the lawyer's confidentiality obligations to the client
- All client information is shared between the lawyer and social worker
- Social workers in this context are not considered "mandated reporters"
