He is the author of “Public International Law: Case Law I & II”, “Theories and Practices of International Aviation Law”, “Introduction to the Protection Act for the Traditional Intellectual Creations of Indigenous Peoples”, “Compilation and Analysis of Critical Court Decisions on Cases Involving Indigenous Peoples” (co-authored with Awi Mona and Huang-Yu Wang), and other academic books, in addition to over 80 journal articles. He has also translated works such as “Revolutionaries” by Eric Hobsbawm.
