According to the Legal Aid Act, everyone may be a recipient of legal aid, irrespective of nationality

Article 14, Section 1, Item 1 of the Legal Aid Act:

The provisions of this Act are applicable to people

The provisions of this Act are also applicable to non-citizens of the Republic of China who meet any one of the following conditions: (Law amended July 1, 2015 to loosen restrictions)


- People who lost their residency due to incidents not imputed to themselves.
- 2 Victims or possible victims in a human trafficking case.
- People who do not reside within the border of the Republic of China may exercise their rights under the laws of the Republic of China when the other party, who received the Foundation's aid in the past for the same cause, passes away.
- People who do not reside within the border of the Republic of China may exercise their rights under the laws of the Republic of China when the other party passes away due to an occupational accident.
- 5 Other conditions as decided by the Foundation.

Legal aid services through video calls for foreigners do not require qualifications

- Available to foreigners in Taiwan
- Book an appointment through filling out an English application form
- The process is assisted by the Legal Aid Foundation staff, a lawyer, and an interpreter
- When necessary, the Foundation will refer the case to apply for legal aid




Providing clear service descriptions to strengthen communication

Multi-lingual Services






- The official website, notification to applicants are offered in multiple languages
- A list of interpreters is established and released
- Payments to interpreters are paid off by the Foundation for those who applied for legal aid and have such payments incurred by handling legal aid cases


Migrant Workers (in Productive Industries and in Social Welfare) in Taiwan - by Nationality (as of June 2023)



Migrant Workers by Types of Work (as of 2022)









Ocean Pioneer (China)

Number of legal aid recipients: 4 Burmese

Type of aid needed: Salary payment

- Referred by a Burmese service agency to work on the vessel, the crew members had not received their salary since April 2020. In October of the same year, the vessel lost engine power off the Taiwan Strait. The entire crew was abandoned by the ship owner and service agency without food and water.
- The captain requested for an emergency entry to the Taipei Port on October 11, 2020. The port then arranged tugboats to pull the vessel into the port to harbor.



KING MIDAS (Sierra Leone)

Der Yun (Belize)

Number of legal aid recipients: 6 Burmese, 2 Chinese

Type of aid needed: Salary payment, human trafficking, and provisional attachment

- The cargo ship entered the Taipei Port to load cargo and was expected to leave on October 10, 2019, but due to some reasons, it harbored until August 2021. Hence, the crew members were forced to stay on the ship.
- The court adopted interpretations favoring the migrant workers in regard to "who is the actual employer".

UNIPROFIT (Belize)

Number of legal aid recipients: 5 Chinese, 1 Indonesian

Type of aid needed: Salary payment

- 2022.3.23: The cargo ship was stranded off the Taitung coast, and was pulled to the Kaohsiung Port under the arrangement of Maritime and Port Bureau (Taitung Office)
- Salary payment was not made to the crew during their stay on the stranded ship
- 2022.10.21: After multiparty negotiations and their compliance to Taiwan's Covid-19 Prevention Measures, the crew members entered Taiwan and departed within a few days

KING MIDAS (Sierra Leone)

Number of legal aid recipients: 5 Burmese; 1 Indonesian

Type of aid needed: Salary payment

- 2019.6.7: Crew members enter Taiwan to board the ship to work
- 2019.12.6: The ship was stranded at the river mouth of Zhoshui River in Western
 Taiwan, and the rescue attempt failed. The captain ordered his crew to look after the
 cargo, yet the ship was running low in supply as time passed
- 2019.12.7: A contingency planning meeting was convened by the Maritime and Port Bureau, Ministry of Transportation and Communications
- 2020.11: The crew members called for help to personnel in the Diocese of Taichung, and were finally able to land in December with the help of agencies and the private sector.
- The crew members received part of the salary after a reconciliation was made as the ship was ordered a provisional attachment



Legal Aid for Vessel and Ship Cases is Complicated and Difficult



The Establishment of Legal Aid Mechanism for Stranded Crew Members/Fishers

Countermeasures

Establish legal aid procedures and mechanisms and proactively invite competent agencies (the Maritime and Port Bureau, MOTC) through the Executive Yuan's Anti-Exploitation Action Plan

Assistance from NGOs

Assistance from shipping agents

Challenges

Stranded crew members/fishers have not entered Taiwan and therefore does not qualify for the condition of "legal entry" stipulated in Article 14 of the Legal Aid Act

Relevant legal aid documents must be provided

How do legal aid recipients work with their attorney after departure?



Challenges to Overcome

- Foreign students instead of migrant workers are recruited to be exploited
- The protection and legalization on the rights of domestic workers
- Illegal service fees charged among migrant workers
