





# Recognizing the Protection of Crime Victim's Rights

## 2017 National Conference on Judicial Reform

In 2017, Taiwan convened the National Conference on Judicial Reform. This was prompted by the recognition that Taiwan's judicial system had long emphasized the roles of judges, prosecutors, and defense lawyers, while overlooking other parties in the judicial process. Therefore, issues related to victims, persons with disabilities, indigenous peoples, and migrant workers and immigrants were designated as the topics for the first group discussion.

## 2020 Participation in Proceedings by the Victim

In 2020, the Code of Criminal Procedure was amended and the chapter on the participation of crime victims in legal proceedings was promulgated. It explicitly stipulated that crime victims have the right to apply to the court for participation, allowing their voices to be heard more effectively in court.

# Changes of the Legal Aid Foundation



#### Real-time Legal Advice


On February 1, 2023, the LAF launched a legal advice hotline for victims. Crime victims can directly call the dedicated line to receive legal advice from lawyers online. On August 1 of the same year, a pilot video-conferencing legal advice hotline for gender equality was initiated.

### **Expanding the Eligibility of Legal Aid Services**

In line with the amendments to the Code of Criminal Procedure, which introduced the system of victim participation in litigation, the LAF stipulated that in cases where the victim is permitted to participate in the litigation, they may be granted the aid of legal representation during the trial. The legal aid lawyer must inquire about the victim's willingness to apply for litigation participation and exercise their rights.

### Single Contact and Service Referral Mechanism

Starting in 2021, the LAF and the Association for Victims Support collaborated to promote a single point of contact and service referral mechanism, establishing a single contact point within both organizations to facilitate case referrals.

Taiwan has implemented various measures to protect the rights of crime victims. These measures are governed by several laws, including the Crime Victim Rights Protection Act, the Domestic Violence Prevention Act, the Sexual Assault Crime Prevention Act, and the Human Trafficking Prevention Act. These laws may overlap regarding service eligibility, items, and scope. To address this, relevant agencies should establish a collaborative platform to facilitate the timely referral of cases. This will be an important focus for the observation and evaluation of implementing the new laws.
