Biography

Dr. Wang Pei-ling has dedicated nearly 30 years to the prevention of gender-based violence, child protection, and advocacy for victims' rights. She has participated in legislative discussions for the Domestic Violence Prevention Act and the Sexual Assault Crime Prevention Act, and has been involved in the planning and implementation following their enactment. In recent years, she has vigorously promoted the legislation of the Anti-Stalking and Harassment Act and the establishment and amendment of laws for preventing digital gender violence.

She developed the “Taiwan Intimate Partner Violence Danger Assessment (TIPVDA),” “Multifaceted Indicators for Intimate Partner Violence Assessment,” and the “Campus Dating Violence Danger Assessment,” which are all widely used by frontline workers now. Additionally, she has planned and promoted Taiwan's “Program for Reducing Repeated Testimonies of Victims in Sexual Assault Cases” and the “Family Violence Safety Protection Network” to advocate for network cooperation.

Her current research focuses on digital gender violence, intimate partner violence, sexual violence, stalking, harassment, and danger assessment.
