Biography

Graduated with a Bachelor's and a Master's degree in Criminal Law from the National Taiwan University (NTU) College of Law. Passed the bar examination in 2008. In 2015, awarded a long-term scholarship by the Japan-Taiwan Exchange Association to study in Japan, and obtained a Ph.D. in Law from Hitotsubashi University in 2019 with a dissertation titled "The Theoretical Basis for Illegal State Investigative Actions as Sentencing Factors." Specializes in punishment and sentencing theory, criminal procedure law, and empirical legal studies. Currently, the main research focuses on lay participation and sentencing, the death penalty in East Asia, and indigenous peoples in Taiwan's criminal justice system. Several papers have been published in the International Journal of Transitional Justice, Academia Sinica Law Journal, NTU Law Journal, and other journals. Aspires to integrate Taiwanese criminal law scholarship with the global community and foster more diverse dialogues.
